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D.2 EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

Equipment shall meet all standards established by specification or incorporated by reference and shall be maintained in good repair by the Contractor.

D.2.1 Contractor Provided Equipment

- All necessary personnel, tools, and equipment to repair chainsaws and other small engines.
- Contractor is responsible for proper disposal of hazardous waste.

D.2.2 Consumable Goods

Contractor shall provide consumable goods (e.g. shop towels, lubricants) necessary to repair chainsaws and other small engines. These consumables will not be replaced by the Government.

D.2.3 Work Orders

The Contractor shall complete their standard commercial repair order form or the Incident Equipment Repair Order provided in Exhibit K to document work done on equipment. If the standard commercial repair order form is used, the following information shall be included for each piece of equipment repaired:

- Name of equipment owner/representative
- Incident Name/Number/Resource Order Number
- Equipment Description (include year, make, model, serial number, etc.)
- Description of work performed
- Breakdown of labor hours/parts and cost
- Printed name/title and signature of equipment owner/representative.

a. Payment.

- i. **Daily Rate** - Payment will be made on basis of calendar days (0001 – 2400). For fractional days at the beginning and ending of time under hire, payment will be based on 50 percent of the Daily Rate for periods less than 8 hours.

- 1) Payment of the daily rate for travel to and from the incident and between incidents will be calculated as follows: Travel miles from point of hire / 45 mph (ref. D.6.5.2) / 11 hours X daily rate.

- b. **Reimbursement of Supplies.** Actual cost of parts used in the repair of equipment will be reimbursed. Parts used must be documented on a work order (ref. D.2.3) and supported by supplier invoices.
