## Additional Mission Statement

- Provide IMT sufficient to support assigned saw crews
- Provide aviation support regarding the coordination of response aircraft into and out of FAA established Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) zones and other safety related issues to a multi-agency Federal aviation disaster response operation
- Provide additional aviation support to assist and act as a deputy for the local FEMA Air Ops Branch Director
  - Provide com techs capable of RF restoration to include antenna replacement, repeater troubleshooting, and tower certifications. Include appropriate transportation and tools to effect local and state emergency RF restoration
  - Provide support to Eastern Area Coordination Center (EACC) for expanded dispatch to handle and process ESF4 resource orders
  - Provide other emergency response resources, as appropriate to ESF4 and requested by FEMA
  - Eight (8) 20-person crews to clear woody debris from roads for emergency vehicle access. Each crew must have two (2) C qualified fallers and four(4) or more A/B fallers, all with chainsaws; provide own transportation for personnel and equipment; four(4) or more handheld radios; four(4) or more agency cell phones; two(2) days supply of MRE's and water.
  - Short Type 2 IMT composed of ICT2, TIME, PROC, OPS or DIVS, SOFL, (2) STKL or DIVS to support saw crews
  - One (1) USFS Air Space Coordination Specialist to assist FEMA's Air Operation Branch with Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFRs) and other safety related activities of a multi-agency disaster response operation involving numerous Federal aviation assets.
  - One (1) USFS aviation specialist (AOBD or similar) to assist FEMA aviation branch director.
  - Provide ESF #2 with 12 communication technicians (COMT) to be split into 6 separate teams, capable of RF restoration to include antenna replacement, repeater troubleshooting, and tower certifications. Include appropriate transportation and tools to effect local and state emergency RF restoration.
- All resources, except saw crews, to be self-sufficient.
