

SUBJECT: U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) -Wide Bi-weekly Pay
Cap Waiver

We are requesting a waiver to exceed the bi-weekly pay cap for employees called into service in response to the Deepwater Horizon in the Gulf of Mexico, and under the provisions of the Pollution Removal Funding Authority. Employees throughout the USDA have responded to the priority of ensuring all capabilities (government, private, and commercial) and resources are being leveraged to protect the environment and facilitate a rapid, robust cleanup effort. To accomplish the work employees may be asked to restrict the use of leave, and work expanded hours. To accomplish the task before us the authorized use of overtime and compensatory time will be necessary. Because of the additional hours, however, there are employees who are quickly approaching and exceeding the biweekly pay cap imposed by 5 USC§5547 (a) and. 5 CFR§550.105(a).

To ensure that we can appropriately compensate employees for overtime worked, we seek approval under 5 CFR§550.106 (b) (1) *For any pay period in which the head of an agency (or designee), in his or her sold discretion, determines that an employee is needed to perform work that is critical to the mission of the agency, the agency may pay premium pay under the limitations described in paragraph (c) of this section...instead of under the biweekly limitation describe in 5 CFR § 550.105(a).*

The waiver request is made for the beginning of pay period 18 which begins, August 29, 2010, through the end of pay period 24 which ends, December 4, 2010. This is a critical time for the environment and habitat on and off shore of the Gulf of Mexico, and as always, the fine employees within the USDA are stepping up to assist.
