

Overview of the Travel Plan 2006 Project Public Meeting

Canyon Elementary School, Cataldo, Idaho

May 31, 2006

Public Notification

The public was notified of the meeting using a variety of methods:

- 1) A newsletter was mailed to 130 addresses.
- 2) Email messages were sent to 37 addresses.
- 3) A printed flyer was posted at 48 locations throughout northern Idaho.
- 4) A news release was sent to television, radio and newspapers throughout northern Idaho and the Spokane area. Information regarding the meeting was published in the Shoshone News-Press.
- 5) Project Team members and the District Rangers shared information about the meeting during conversations with members of the public.

A total of 75 attendees signed in for the meeting, which began at 6:30 p.m. Attendees represented individual interests, motorized recreation, winter recreation (snowmobile, Nordic skiing), nonmotorized recreation, and environmental organizations. 
When signing in, attendees were given a copy of the steps for registering and screening proposed changes to the existing travel route system. Also available to them were copies of the Forest Service 2005 Travel Rule Federal Register Notice, the April and May 2006 newsletters that were sent to the public, an overview of the project based on the slideshow that was presented at the April 27 public meeting, and the five maps that comprise the routes available for consideration on the entire Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District (on compact disk). Additional process and timeline information was provided on wall posters.

Program Overview

The meeting started with a 20-minute overview by Project Team Leader Linda McFaddan. She recapped the progress made in the last month, and went through the steps for registering and screening proposed changes to the existing travel route system. After a few questions and answers, the attendees began registering and screening their proposed changes. A number of people indicated they were still working on their proposals, and would submit them at a later date.

At about 8:15 p.m., the attendees regrouped and Linda McFaddan thanked them for their attendance and participation. A total of 56 proposals had been registered. Linda acknowledged the need for the public to have accessibility to the screening overlays and more detailed geographic locations, and stated the overlays and more detailed District map would be made available on the project website, on compact disk, and in printed copy at the District's Smelterville and Fernan offices. Linda announced that the next meeting would be held Thursday, June 22, in Coeur d'Alene, and that a letter will go out by June 8 announcing the time and location of the meeting.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 8:30 p.m.
