Welcome to the Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie. The U.S. Forest Service is pleased to offer 7,200 acres of the Prairie to general public access in 2008. Any lands open to the public are open to deer hunting, unless otherwise posted.

The Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie is managed by the U.S. Forest Service and is a federal facility. State hunting laws as outlined in the Illinois Digest of Hunting and Trapping Regulations 2008-2009 are enforced at Midewin with the additions in this publication.

Special Hunt Area rules have been developed for all hunting at Midewin consistent with U.S. Forest Service policies and guidelines for recreation and public access. Other supplemental and short-term policies have also been developed because the Army continues to clean up contamination within Midewin's boundaries and because the Prairie is undergoing restoration to native habitats. All of these conditions combine to provide a unique recreational experience at Midewin for all visitors.

We expect interest in hunting at Midewin to continue to grow. Successful management of this program will depend on all recreationists – hunters, hikers, bicyclists, birdwatchers, and equestrians – understanding the rules and being considerate of each other. Please protect the quality of your and others' recreation experience by packing out trash to parking lot receptacles and dragging gut piles away from visitor areas.

HUNTING SEASONS	<p>Midewin is open for the following deer hunting seasons:</p> <p><u>Archery</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• October 1 through November 20, 2008• November 24 through December 3, 2008 and• December 8, 2008 through January 15, 2009 <p><u>Firearm</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• November 21-23, 2008 and• December 4-7, 2008 <p><u>Muzzleloader-Only</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• December 12-14 <p>Hunting with handguns is not permitted at Midewin.</p> <p>There are no antler restrictions at Midewin.</p> <p>Taking any game or nongame species other than deer at Midewin is prohibited.</p>
AREAS OPEN TO HUNTING	<p>All areas open to the general public are also open to deer hunting. A total of 7,200 acres is open for hunting this year.</p> <p>It is very important to consult the provided maps for detailed information on the boundaries of the open areas. Lands outside these boundaries are not open to public access and trespassers may be cited and fined. Some lands outside these boundaries are still being cleaned up by the Army and may present hazards to trespassers.</p> <p><u>If a wounded deer crosses into a closed area of Midewin, the hunter must contact the Forest Service at (815) 263-4060 to obtain permission to track it.</u></p> <p>In addition to Forest Service boundary maps, USGS topographic maps for lands within the Midewin boundaries are available for sale at the Midewin Welcome Center.</p>

PERMITS & PASSES	<p>All firearm hunting permits at Midewin are issued through the Illinois DNR lottery system for Special Hunt Areas.</p> <p>In addition, all hunters must obtain a hunting pass from the Midewin Welcome Center. There is no charge for this pass. <u>Hunters must show their state-issued hunting license in order to get a Midewin hunting pass.</u></p> <p>The pocket portion of the pass must be carried at all times while hunting at Midewin. The larger portion of the pass must be placed so it is clearly visible through the front windshield. At the end of the season, this pass must be completed and returned to Midewin.</p> <p>The Midewin hunting pass also entitles hunters to be on site from two hours before sunrise until two hours after sunset -- earlier and later than the general public.</p> <p>Any violation of the rules and regulations may result in the forfeiture of hunting privileges at Midewin for the remainder of the season and issuance of a citation.</p>
TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT CLOSURES	<p>Management activities, volunteer workdays, and public programs will occur periodically throughout the deer hunting season. The Forest Service may temporarily or permanently close areas to hunting. Refer to the bulletin boards in the parking lots or call the Midewin Welcome Center for the most up-to-date information.</p> <p>Midewin makes every effort to inform hunters of closures and activities ahead of time. Sometimes this is not possible but the management activity will go on.</p>
PUBLIC ACCESS	<p>All hunting areas are open to the general public. The following guidelines must be observed and will be enforced to ensure a safe and enjoyable recreational experience for all visitors.</p> <p>Access to public lands at Midewin is by nonmotorized means only – hiking, bicycling, horseback riding, snow shoeing, or cross country skiing. Trails are not snow plowed in the winter. Hunters are welcome to use game carts.</p> <p>There are nearly 22 miles of interim trails available for recreational access, including 17 miles for shared use by hikers, bicyclists, and equestrians and 5 miles for hikers only. <u>There are no bicycle or equestrian trails on Midewin's west side at this time.</u></p> <p>Equestrians and bicyclists are required to stay on these designated interim trails at all times of the year. Hikers are restricted to trails only during firearm hunting seasons. Hunters should be aware that visitors will be using the trails during their hunt and locate accordingly. All visitors during hunting season are advised to wear blaze orange for safety.</p> <p>The Forest Service prohibits shooting in or within 150 yards of any</p>

	<p>building, developed recreation site, or occupied area. At Midewin, this particularly means <u>no shooting when hikers, bicyclists, or equestrians are within 150 yards</u>. Shooting across roads, bodies of water, and cemeteries is also prohibited.</p> <p>Hunters using bicycles or horses to get part way to their hunting sites must obey state laws regarding transportation of firearms. <u>Firearms must be unloaded and completely cased while riding horses or bicycles at Midewin</u>.</p> <p>There is no camping at Midewin, including the parking lots. Hunters may begin using any of the six parking lots beginning 3 hours before sunrise.</p>
HUNTING STANDS	<p>Construction or use of permanent deer stands is not permitted at Midewin. Only portable stands that do no permanent damage to trees are permitted. Do not cut tree limbs. Hunting stands may <u>not</u> be left in place overnight at Midewin; hunting stands in violation of these rules may be confiscated.</p>
ACCESSIBLE HUNTING BLINDS	<p>Accessible hunting blinds may be reserved for hunters with an Illinois P1A or P2A Disability card. Reservations must be made at the Midewin Welcome Center. Hunters must also sign in and out of the accessible blind at the parking lot trailhead on the day of their hunt.</p> <p>Only hunters with a reservation may use an accessible blind. No other hunters may hunt within 50 yards of an accessible blind when it is occupied. The only exception is the companion assisting the hunter reserving the accessible blind. This companion is also not counted in the number of hunters limited to any zone on the east side.</p> <p>Restrictions on motorized access at Midewin apply to disabled hunters, as well, with the exception of a motorized device designed solely for use by a mobility-impaired person for locomotion, <u>and</u> that is suitable for use in an <u>indoor</u> pedestrian area.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Designed solely for use by a mobility-impaired person” means that the original design and manufacture of the wheelchair was only for the purpose of mobility for a person who has a disability. This does not include after-market retrofit of a motorized unit to make it useable by a person who has a disability. • “Suitable for indoor pedestrian use” means useable inside a home, mall, courthouse, etc. (Forest Service Manual 2353.05 and ADA Title V Section 507c)
SUNRISE/SUNSET	<p>Exact sunrise and sunset times are listed in the Illinois Digest of Hunting and Trapping Regulations. Remember, <u>hunters must add one hour to sunrise and sunset times in the IDNR table through October 31 to account for Daylight Savings Time</u>.</p>
SUCCESSFUL HUNT	<p>Last year, 1,037 people registered to hunt at Midewin, 105 firearm permits were issued, and 83 deer* were reported harvested.</p>

<p data-bbox="151 737 410 806">PRAIRIE UNDER CONSTRUCTION</p>	<p data-bbox="513 737 1398 831">The Forest Service, together with the Illinois DNR and the support of hundreds of volunteers and partner agencies, businesses, and organizations, is working to restore the prairie to the Prairie State.</p> <p data-bbox="513 869 1463 1035">You can watch this process in action over the years during your visits to Midewin. It may look more like a construction site in some areas, but the activities you will see are actually important steps in rebuilding the natural habitats, biodiversity, and landscape. A variety of “construction” activities are part of the restoration process:</p> <ul data-bbox="513 1041 1455 1318" style="list-style-type: none"> • demolition of abandoned buildings, • cutting of non-native or invasive trees and brush, • application of herbicide to non-native or invasive plants, • earthmoving equipment restoring the shape of the land, • cattle grazing to maintain grassland bird habitat, • farm equipment planting, mowing, spraying Roundup, and harvesting to restore desired or keep out unwanted plant species, and • Army cleanup of contamination. <p data-bbox="513 1356 1459 1451">Visitors may observe equipment, supplies, flagging, or structures placed to support these restoration activities or research. Please respect private property and ongoing work by not disturbing these materials.</p> <p data-bbox="513 1488 1403 1619">Some hunters are concerned that vegetation changes will reduce the deer habitat and population. While short-term disturbance may drive deer to less busy areas, the long-term restoration is not expected to significantly affect the size of the deer herd at Midewin.</p>															
<p data-bbox="151 1652 383 1686">OTHER RULES</p>	<p data-bbox="513 1652 1451 1747">No motorized vehicles may be used for recreation at Midewin. Visitors may, however, see vehicles being used for the ongoing work of restoring the prairie.</p> <p data-bbox="513 1785 1438 1915">Some activities are not allowed at Midewin, including camping, fishing, swimming, collecting plants, and pursuits that may disturb the soil, such as metal detection. If you have a question about whether an activity is permitted at Midewin, please ask at the Welcome Center.</p>															

	<p><u>Heritage Resources</u>: Disturbing or removing any prehistoric, historic, or archaeological resource, site, artifact, property, or structure is prohibited.</p> <p><u>Dogs</u>: Dogs are currently welcome at Midewin as long they are on a maximum 8-foot leash and stay on the trail.</p> <p><u>Livestock & Gates</u>: Cattle are helping maintain grassland bird habitat by keeping grass at the height preferred by different bird species for nesting and feeding. Please <u>keep pasture gates closed</u> and do not disturb the cows.</p> <p><u>Traffic</u>: Operators of heavy equipment on the roads and in the fields may not be able to see or hear visitors. Stay well away from this equipment. Some areas may be posted closed during project work.</p> <p><u>Arsenic contamination</u>: Commercial weed-killing sprays used along security fencelines and railbeds in the 1960s contained high concentrations of arsenic, which remain in the soil in some areas. Arsenic contamination may not be apparent because of growing vegetation. Do not disturb the soil at Midewin.</p>

WEST SIDE RULES & PROCEDURES

DEER HUNTING AREAS	<p>There are 2,870 acres open to the public on the west side of Midewin.</p> <p>There are no bicycle trails on the west side of Midewin.</p>
WEST SIDE PARKING	<p>There are four parking lots available for public use on the west side:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explosives Road Trailhead (P5) at old Gate 10 west of State Route 53; and • P1, P3, and P4 north of River Road between I-55 and State Route 53. • P3: An 8-foot-tall game fence surrounds the River Road native seed production garden, including the parking lot at P3. This fence was installed to reduce damage to prairie plants and seeds by browsing deer. Walk-through gates are available at the west and east ends of the enclosure and to either side of the north gate on Boathouse Road. Please keep these gates closed.
WEST SIDE POSTED HUNTING SITES	<p>Hunters on the west side of Midewin must sign in and out of designated hunting locations (posted sites).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hunters may enter parking lots 3 hours before sunrise to prepare for entering Midewin no earlier than 2 hours before sunrise. Hunters may sign in for their hunting site upon entering the parking lot. All hunters must sign out no later than two hours after sunset. • Hunters must hunt within 50 yards of the posted site number.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Moving from one hunting site to another requires signing out and back into the new location. • ODD-numbered hunting sites may be used <u>only</u> on ODD-numbered calendar days. • EVEN-numbered sites may be used <u>only</u> on EVEN-numbered calendar days. • GPS coordinates for posted hunting sites are available at the Midewin Welcome Center or online at the Midewin website at www.fs.fed.us/mntp/. <p>Note: There are no designated hunting sites north of Grant Creek in P1 North. The recommended maximum number of hunters in this area is 5.</p>

EAST SIDE RULES & PROCEDURES

<p>DEER HUNTING AREAS</p>	<p>There are 4,347 acres open to the public on the east side of Midewin.</p> <p><u>Under no circumstances</u> is the public allowed into closed areas on Midewin's east side. The Army is cleaning up contamination in these areas and this prohibition is to protect public safety. Trespassers may be cited and fined.</p> <p>A game fence has been constructed around the Chicago Road native seed production gardens, located at the northwest corner of Zone 6, to protect prairie plants and seeds from deer. Please keep the gates closed.</p>
<p>EAST SIDE PARKING</p>	<p>There are two parking lots available for public use on the east side of Midewin.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Hoff Road Trailhead is located on Hoff Road two miles east of State Route 53. Hunting zones 3 through 7 may be accessed from this parking lot. • The Iron Bridge Trailhead is located on the east side of State Route 53, about 2.5 miles north of the Welcome Center and just north of the iron railroad overpass. Zones 1 and 2 may be accessed from this parking lot. • In addition, entry into Midewin is available from the Wauponsee Trail at Road 1 North or Offner Road on Midewin's eastern boundary; however, there is no parking available at this access point and the Forest Preserve District of Will County currently prohibits carrying weapons on the Wauponsee Trail (General Use Regulation Ordinance No. 124, Ch. V, Sec. 5).

**EAST SIDE
HUNTING ZONES**

Hunters on the east side of Midewin must sign in and out of designated hunting zones.

- Hunters may enter the parking lot 3 hours before sunrise to prepare for entering Midewin no earlier than 2 hours before sunrise. Hunters may sign in for their hunting zone upon entering the parking lot. All hunters must sign out no later than two hours after sunset.
- Hunters may hunt anywhere within their designated zone.
- Changing zones requires returning to the sign in/out list to sign out and back into the new zone.
- Each zone has an optimum recommended number of hunters that may be signed in at any one time.

Exceeding this number of hunters reduces the quality of the hunting experience for all.
