

NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM TRAILS
CLEARWATER NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(b), the following acts are prohibited on designated portions of Forest Development Trail 419, within the Clearwater National Forest. These prohibitions go into effect immediately and will remain in effect until rescinded.

1. Using any motorized vehicles prohibited by this order. 36 CFR 261.55 (b)

This restriction applies to motorized vehicles on Forest Development Trail 419, the Fish Lake Trail, from the end of Forest Development Road 295 [T40N R12E S5] to the junction with Forest Development Trail 738 [T40N R12E S11].

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), the following are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited use.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

The above restrictions are necessary for resource protection. This trail is wet, and motorized traffic could cause resource damage.
