

# FOREST SUPERVISOR'S ORDER

05-05-06

Pursuant to 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on Forest roads, trails, and restricted areas on or administered by the Clearwater National Forest and described in the documents listed below. These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, and will remain in effect until rescinded.

1. Use of roads, trails or areas under National Forest jurisdiction in violation of travel restrictions listed in the Clearwater National Forest Travel Guide (2005 Revision).

**Consult the road and trail index in the Travel Guide to determine which of the restrictions (at right) applies to an individual road, trail segment or area.**

2. Operating any vehicle defined by Idaho Code [I.C. 49-123 (2)], and any "All terrain vehicle (ATV)" [I.C. 67-7101 (1)], "Motorbike" [I.C. 67-7101 (9)] or "Snowmobile" [I.C. 67-7101 (14)] on roads under National Forest jurisdiction in violation of Idaho Code, law or regulation pertaining to vehicle registration and operator license requirements, [36 CFR 261.54 (d)].
3. Operating a vehicle carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the rights or safety of other persons, or in a manner or at a speed that would endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property [36 C.F.R. 261.54 (f)].

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. 261.50 (e), the following are exempt from restriction No. 1 shown above:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited use.
2. Any Federal or State Law Enforcement Officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of and official duty.

The above restrictions are necessary for public safety, protection of property, and/or prevention of resource damage.

**Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).**

## TRAVEL-RELATED RESTRICTIONS

**36 CFR 261.53 SPECIAL CLOSURES** ... it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

**36 CFR 261.53 (e)** - Public health or safety.

**36 CFR 261.54 NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROADS** . . . the following are prohibited:

**36 CFR 261.54 (a)** - Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order.

**36 CFR 261.54 (b)** - Use by any type of traffic prohibited by the order.

**36 CFR 261.54 (e)** - Being on the road.

**36 CFR 261.55 FOREST DEVELOPMENT TRAILS** . . . the following are prohibited on a forest development trail:

**36 CFR 261.55 (b)** - Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order.

**36 CFR 261.55 (c)** - Use by any type of traffic or mode of transport prohibited by the order.

**36 CFR 261.56 USE OF VEHICLES OFF NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROADS**

**36 CFR 261.56** - it is prohibited to possess or use a vehicle off National Forest System roads.

**36 CFR 261.58 OCCUPANCY AND USE** . . . the following are prohibited:

**36 CFR 261.58 (b)** - Entering or using a developed recreation site or portion thereof.

**36 CFR 261.58 (w)** - Possessing or transporting any motor or mechanical device capable of propelling a watercraft through water by any means.

**36 CFR 261.58 (aa)** - Riding, hitching, tethering, or hobbling a horse or other saddle or pack animal in violation of posted instructions.
