

## What will be expected of workshop participants?

Each participating teacher will be responsible for developing a curriculum unit that meets Montana's educational standards and grade level expectations. Curriculum units must be based on real-world learning experiences within their local communities. Each team of teachers will develop a service-learning project that brings the school and the community together, where teachers and students learn about local forestry issues and become involved in a viable community-based project.

Teachers will receive \$100 in resource money to support your teaching and an opportunity to apply for a \$200 mini-grant for your classroom.

- Include service learning in your students' experience.
- Provide written documentation of your curriculum for possible inclusion in a model program to be disseminated nationally.
- Submit a reflection piece upon completion of this program, possibly including reflection on implementation of your unit as time allows.
