a. The intent of this project is to build upon the work that we have already accomplished, as landowners. We will be applying all of the knowledge that was learned in the Headwaters of the Little Prickly Pear Noxious Weed Program, with the project itself being a learning tool. You always learn when you are working in the field. That's why we call for field trials.

1. Mapping the area, showing the land location, legal description, ledger describing the marks and symbols used to map acreage/ size of infestation.

2. Herbicide application will be performed by landowners and commercial applicators.

3. We will target species such as Spotted Knapweed, Canada, Musk and Bull thistle, Yellow and Dalmatian Toadflax, Perennial Pepper weed, Hounds tongue, Field Bindweed, Cockle burrs, Mullen and others that we deem need attention as we traverse the landscape.

4. Methods of Application: WE will be using horse's ATV's, backpacks, handguns, broad jets, and or boom mounted to trucks and trailers. Along with any other devise we deem useable along the way.

5. Cautions: Avoid recreation conflicts, standing water, use only chemicals specified for riparian areas and vegetation. Be vigilant and careful with lighter textured soil areas.

6. Be cognoscente about air quality and the heat factor when spraying.

7. Be considerate of wildlife, fish, threaten and or sensitive species.

8. Perform educational programs

9. Do Narrative Reports similar to the one on Attachment C and use the Daily Log that we have already created.
