- 0026598-003    I urge that the Chugach National Forest be managed as a wild life, fish, plant habitat, sanctuary preserve wilderness and to provide a habitat preserve sanctuary for the following species:
- Harlequin duck, Brown Bear, Black Oyster Catcher, Dusky Canada Goose Moose, Mountain Goat, Gray Wolf, Lynx, Marbled Marmet, Montague Island, Hoary Marmont, River otter, Bistre Black tailed deer, Townsend Warbler, wolverine, Bald Eagle, Humpbacked Whale, Montague Island Tundra Yak, Northern Goshawk Osprey, [Illegible], Peregrine Falcon, Trumpter Swans Chum, Coho, Cutthroat, Dally Varden, Ring, Pink, Sockeye, Eschscholtz's little nightmarer, [Illegible] [Illegible] Goose - grass ledge, [Illegible], Tundna Whitlow - [Illegible], [Illegible] [Illegible], [Illegible] [Illegible] Pale Poppy, smooth [Illegible], mist maiden and circumpolar stanwart
- 0026810-026    General Wildlife: The literature review and citations for most wildlife species in the environmental effects chapter of the DEIS is inconsistent and inadequate. For example, there is substantial literature on deer, mountain goats, and goshawks from similar habitats in southeastern Alaska that is not referenced or included in this review. A more comprehensive and thorough review would significantly strengthen this DEIS.
- The cumulative effects discussion addressing wildlife in the DEIS is quite minimal and superficial. Certainly it would be valuable to summarize the Suring et al. (1998) paper 'Analysis of cumulative effects on brown bears on the Kenai Peninsula, southcentral Alaska.' We suggest that this section should be substantially strengthened in the FEIS.
- Large carnivores are particularly vulnerable to habitat fragmentation and increasing human access. We recommend additional discussion and analysis of these issues related to bears, wolves, lynx, and wolverines on the Kenai Peninsula.
- 0026810-028    We recommend that the Forest Service work closely with the Fish & Wildlife Service in reviewing their standards and guidelines for Marbled Murrelets and Northern Goshawks on the Forest.
- We recommend adding the Kittliz's murrelet and deleting the osprey from Table 2-1 important wildlife in the plan revision.
