

Recreation Opportunity Guide



KEGAN COVE CABIN

DESCRIPTION: The Kegan Cove Cabin was reconstructed in 2010. This original cabin design and kit were supplied by Wood Cuts Inc. of Thorne Bay, AK. All lumber for its construction came from Prince of Wales Island. The cabin kit was constructed on site by a group of Southeast Alaska Guidance Association (SAGA) volunteers.

Kegan Cove Cabin has sleeping space for four to six people. It is heated by a woodstove. Wood is not guaranteed at the cabin.



LOCATION: The cabin sits on saltwater at Moira Sound. It is located 30 air-miles from Ketchikan on the southern portion of Prince of Wales Island. Refer to USGS topo map Craig A-1. Longitude: -132.1705556; Latitude: 55.0225

ACCESS: The cabin can be accessed by floatplane (at high tide, refer to Ketchikan Tide Tables) or boat. It is available for use all year long, however, April through November are often the best months. At low tide there may be up to 100 feet of exposed rocks and tide flats in front of the cabin.

A **mooring buoy** is located in the cove. A reservation for a Forest Service cabin does not include exclusive use of the buoy. Buoy use is on a first-come, first-served basis. Mooring of more than one vessel is allowed, provided the first party there agrees.

SPECIAL FEATURES: This cabin is located within a protected cove in Moira Sound. Ocean fishing, stream fishing, viewing scenery and wildlife, and beachcombing are popular activities at this cabin. The prolific salmon runs draw both anglers and black bear to Kegan Creek. A 1/2-mile trail meanders along the creek connecting Kegan Cove to the cabin on Kegan Creek and to Kegan Lake. The trail is a good place to watch fish or try to catch salmon, steelhead, and trout. Bears, eagles, and gulls and a variety of other birds frequent the area.

FACILITIES:

- Two single and two double-size sleeping spaces
- Woodstove
- Cooking counter, table, shelves, and cupboard space
- Ax/maul/splitting wedges
- Broom
- A natural water source is Kegan Creek

*TREAT OR BOIL WATER BEFORE DRINKING.

*BRING YOUR OWN – stove fuel, sleeping bags, sleeping pads, cooking stove, matches, lantern, pots, pans, plates, utensils, food, toilet paper, and garbage bags.

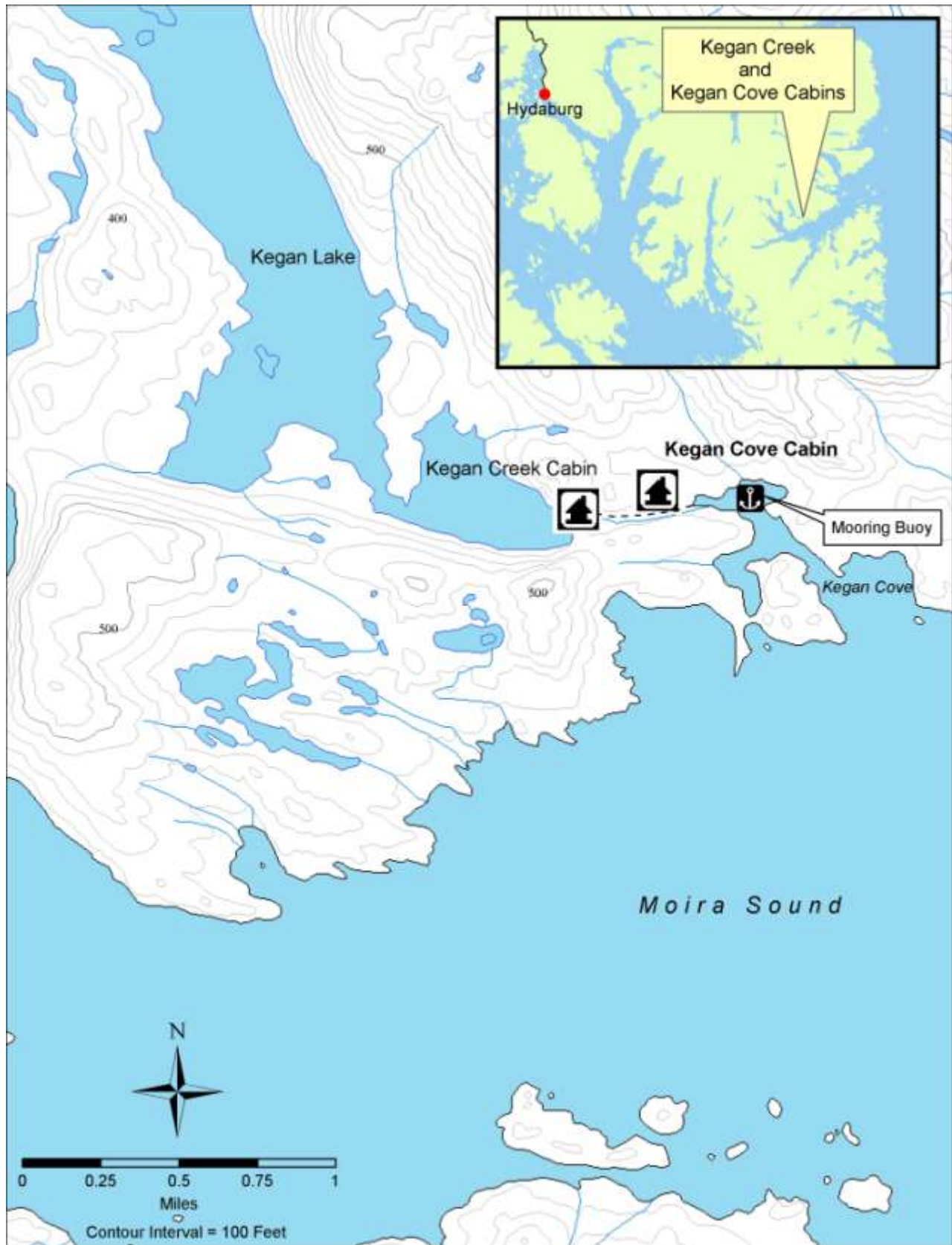
