

# Recreation Opportunity Guide



## KEGAN CREEK CABIN

**DESCRIPTION:** The 12' x 12' [Pan-Abode](#) cedar log cabin was constructed in 1967. The cabin has sleeping space for four to six people. The stove uses #1 diesel fuel, NOT supplied by the Forest Service. Please remember to take your fuel container with you when you leave.



**LOCATION:** The cabin is inland a 1/2-mile from Moira Sound and approximately 200 yards downstream from Kegan Lake. It is 30 air-miles from Ketchikan on the southern portion of Prince of Wales Island. Refer to USGS topo map Craig A-1. Longitude: -132.1783333; Latitude: 55.02166667

**ACCESS:** The cabin can be accessed by floatplane or boat (plan on a 1/2-mile hike). It is available for use all year long, however, April through November are often the best months.

A **mooring buoy** is located at Kegan Cove. A reservation for a Forest Service cabin does not include exclusive use of the buoy. Buoy use is on a first-come, first-served basis. Mooring of more than one vessel is allowed, provided the first party there agrees.

**TERRAIN:** The area surrounding the cabin is flat with a coastal Sitka Spruce and Western Hemlock forest predominating.

**SPECIAL FEATURES:** This cabin sits adjacent to Kegan Creek, just a few hundred yards from the outlet of Kegan Lake. The prolific salmon runs draw both anglers and black bear to Kegan Creek. A trail meanders along the creek, connecting Kegan Creek Cabin to the Kegan Cove Cabin 1/2-mile downstream. The trail is a good place to watch fish or try to catch salmon, steelhead, and trout. Bears, eagles, gulls, and a variety of other birds also frequent the area.

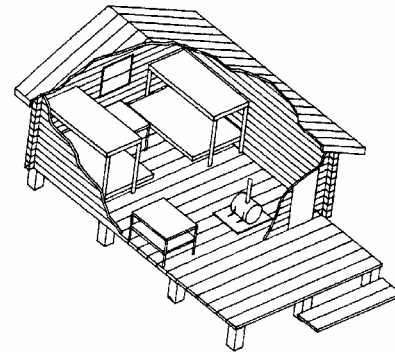
### FACILITIES:

- Two single and two double-size sleeping spaces
- Fuel oil stove (requires #1 diesel fuel – NOT PROVIDED), highest setting = 0.1 gallons/hour
- Cooking counter, table, shelves, and cupboard space
- Broom
- 14' aluminum skiff with oars - floatation devices NOT provided
- A natural water source is Kegan Creek

\*TREAT OR BOIL WATER BEFORE DRINKING.

\*BRING YOUR OWN – stove fuel, sleeping bags, sleeping pads, cooking stove, matches, lantern, pots, pans, plates, utensils, food, toilet paper, and garbage bags.

**CABIN LAYOUT:** There may be slight variations.

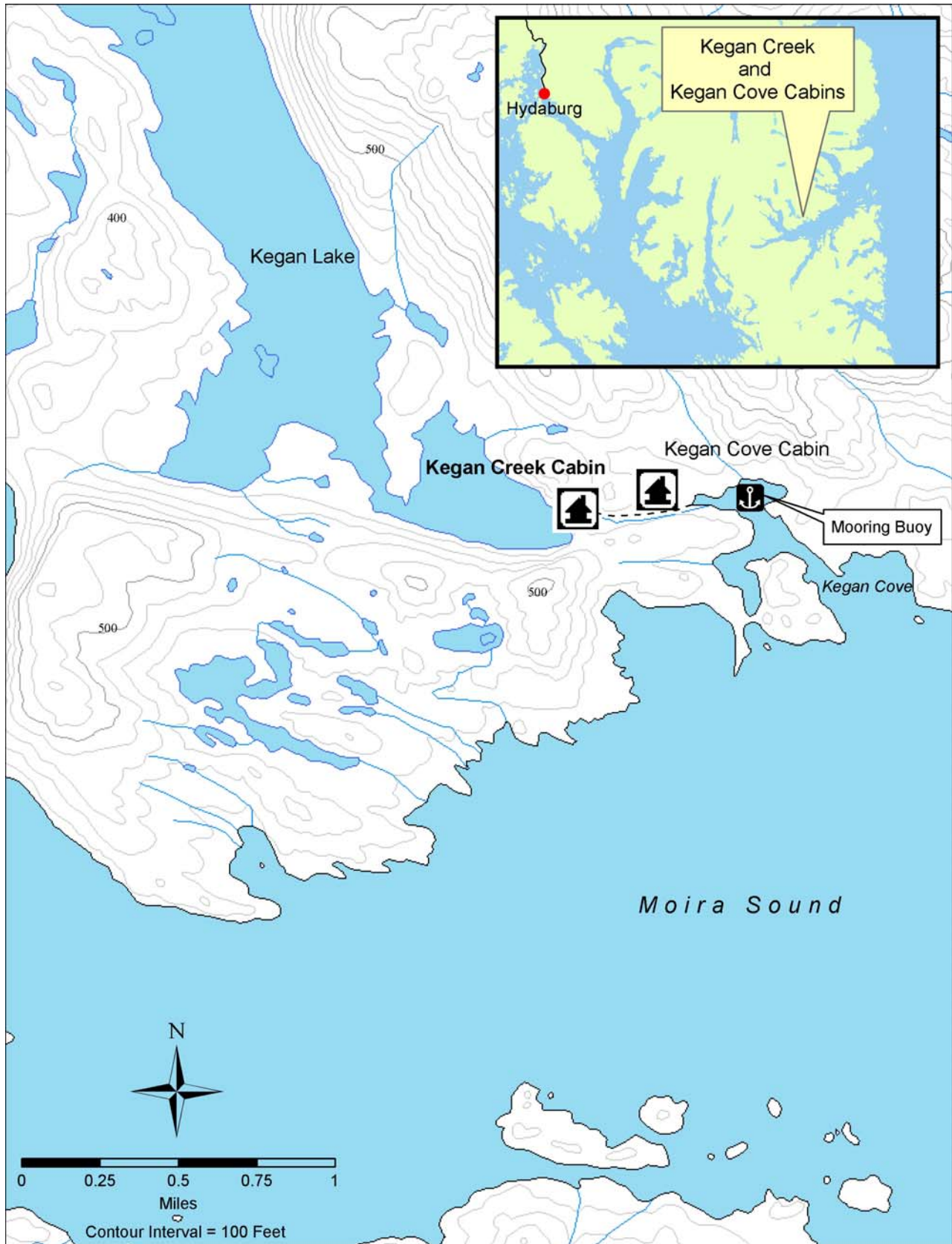
