

Recreation Opportunity Guide



STANEY CREEK CABIN

DESCRIPTION: This is a 12' x 12' [Pan-Abode](#) log cabin with a propane heater and sleeping space for 4 to 6 people. The cabin was built in 1964 and underwent rehabilitation in 1986.



LOCATION: The cabin sits at 30 feet elevation near the mouth of Stanley Creek on west-central Prince of Wales Island. It is 68 air miles from Ketchikan and 56 road miles from Hollis. Refer to USGS topo map Craig D-4. Longitude: -133.1525; Latitude: 55.82055556

ACCESS: The cabin is accessible by road to the trailhead on Forest Road 2054 and a 1/2-mile hike to the cabin.

TERRAIN: The surrounding terrain is generally flat with huge old-growth trees of spruce, hemlock and cedar. At the mouth of Stanley Creek is a large tidal meadow of tall grass.

SPECIAL FEATURES: This cabin is popular for its road access and sport fish opportunities in the Stanley Creek drainage. Cutthroat trout, rainbow trout, dolly varden, and four species of salmon are known to frequent these waters. Ducks and geese are abundant along Stanley Creek and the tidal flats, while bald eagles, gulls and other shore birds often congregate in the tidal zone in front of the cabin. Black bear and Sitka black-tailed deer are common.

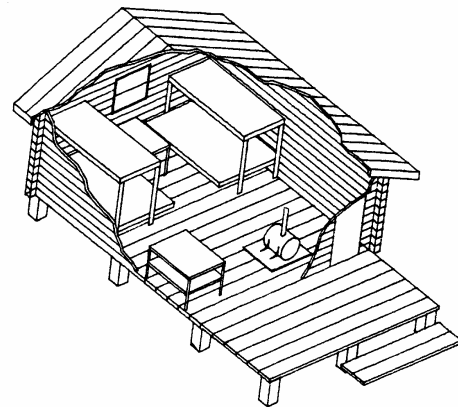
FACILITIES:

- Two single and two double-size sleeping spaces
- Propane heater (no cooking surface) – PROPANE PROVIDED
- Cooking counter, table, shelves, and cupboard space
- Broom

*BRING YOUR OWN WATER - there are no freshwater sources close to the cabin.

*BRING YOUR OWN - sleeping bags, sleeping pads, cooking stove, matches, lantern, pots, pans, plates, utensils, food, toilet paper, and garbage bags.

CABIN LAYOUT: There may be slight variations.

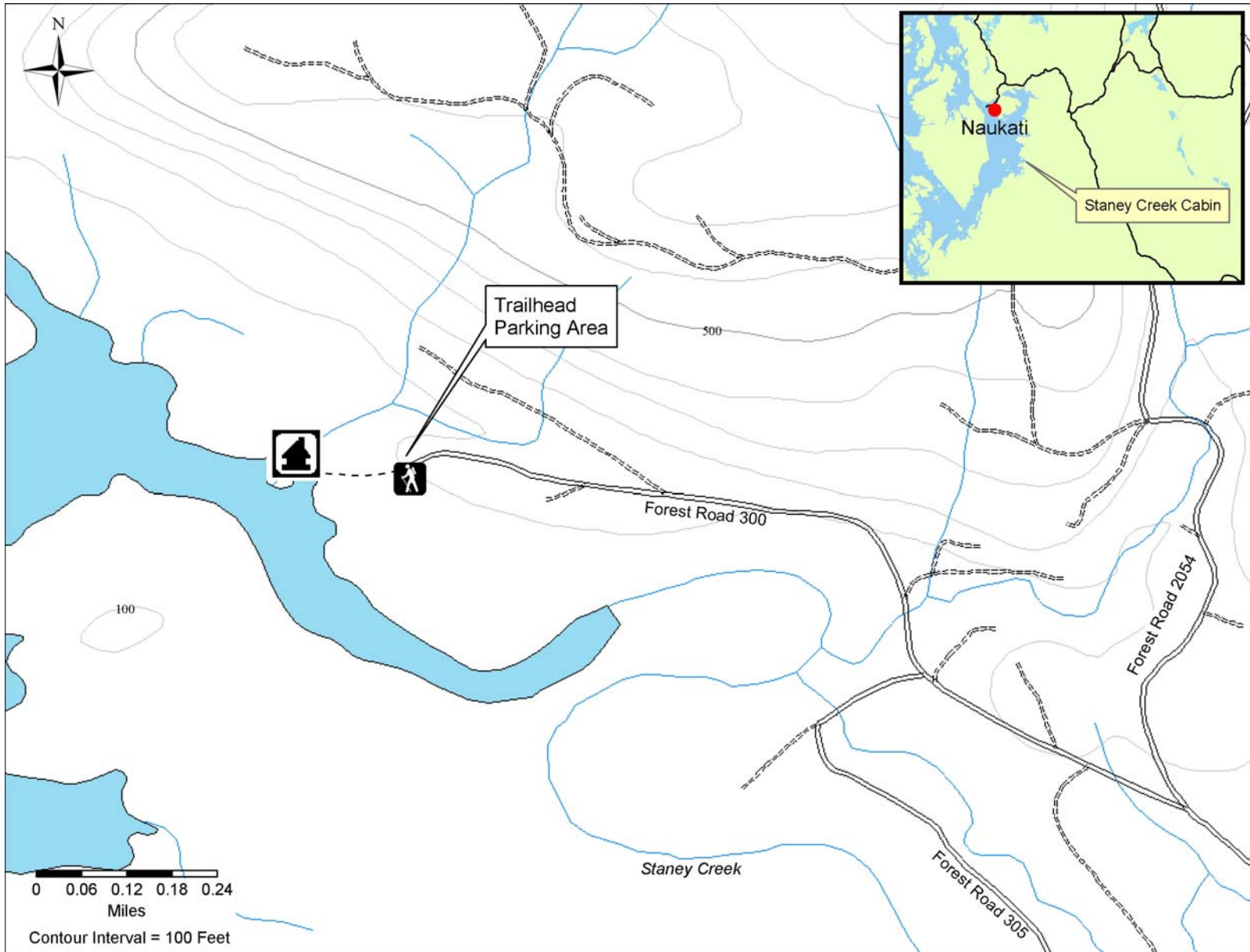
