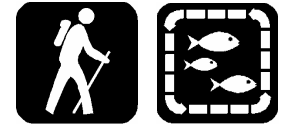


Recreation Opportunity Guide



CABLE CREEK FISH PASS TRAIL

Description: The Cable Creek Fish Pass Trail is a short boardwalk that takes hikers to the Cable Creek Fish Pass.



Access: You can access the Cable Creek Fish Pass Trailhead from State Highway 903 (Hydaburg Road). It is located approximately 8.8 miles from the intersection of the Craig-Hollis Highway and the Hydaburg Road. Parking is available for 2 vehicles.

Distance: 300 feet (one way)

Trip Time: 10 minutes (one way)

Difficulty: Easy

Elevation Change: 30 feet

Terrain: The 300-ft Cable Creek Fish Pass Trail is a fully accessible boardwalk trail.

Attractions: The Cable Creek Fish Pass Trail was constructed as a Youth Conservation Corps project during the mid-1980's. It leads hikers through a spruce hemlock forest to Cable Creek, where a fish pass was designed to extend salmon habitat in the creek. Wildlife viewing is a common activity in this area. Cable Creek has a prolific run of salmon during late summer and fall. The salmon run, in turn, attracts abundant wildlife including bear, eagle and even elusive wolves. There are also salmon lifecycle interpretive signs along the trail. Additional attractions in the area include the Trocadero Trail.



Special Considerations: The boardwalk trail may be slippery. Be careful especially when the trail is wet.

Safety Tips

- ✓ *Discharging firearms is prohibited within 150 yards of cabins and across, or on, a body of water.*

- ✓ *Water for consumption should be treated or boiled.*
- ✓ *Rubber boots, rain gear and insect repellent are recommended.*
