

Recreation Opportunity Guide



DEWEYVILLE TRAIL

Description: The Deweyville Trail travels east and west from Forest Road 20, north of Sarkar Lake. The west branch of the trail accesses Sarkar cove and the east branch Sarkar Lake. A compass is recommended, because this natural tread trail is sometimes difficult to follow.



Attractions: The Deweyville Trail provides access to saltwater and freshwater on either side of Forest Road 20. Bring a fishing pole and try your luck on the salmon in Sarkar Inlet or Dolly Varden and cutthroats from Sarkar Lake.



Admire the old growth spruce trees that line Sarkar Cove. Keep a look out for various waterfowl and wildlife, such as deer, bear and mink.

Special Considerations: The Deweyville Trail is an all natural tread trail. It is recommended that hikers bring a compass or GPS to help direct them.

Access: The Deweyville Trail is located on Forest Road 20, one mile north of the Sarkar Boat Launch.

Distance: 0.7 mile (one way)

Trip Time: 1 hour

Difficulty: Most Difficult

Elevation Change: 100 feet

Terrain: The Deweyville Trail is all natural tread.
