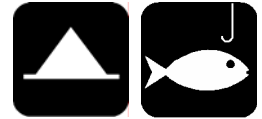


Recreation Opportunity Guide



HORSESHOE HOLE PRIMITIVE CAMPSITES

Description: The Horseshoe Hole primitive campsites are situated at the end of a timber road in the Staney Creek watershed. It is only a quick walk through the woods to Horseshoe Hole on Staney Creek from either of the two campsites. Each site has a hardened tent site, a fire ring and a picnic table.



Access: To access the Horseshoe Hole primitive campsites take the Staney Area turnoff (Forest Road 2054) from Forest Road 20. Follow the 2054 Road for approximately 4 miles, then turn left onto Forest Road 2054300. The campsites are located at the end of this Forest Road.

Campsite Fee: No fee

Stay Limit: 14 Days

Facilities: Tent site, fire ring, picnic table
