## STANEY BRIDGE PRIMITIVE CAMPSITES

**Description:** The Stoney Bridge primitive campsites are located just west of the Stoney Creek crossing on Forest Service Road 2050. There are two campsites, each with a hardened tent site, a fire ring and a picnic table. The Stoney Bridge campsites are within walking distance from Stoney Creek and excellent fishing.



**Attractions:** Stoney Bridge primitive campsites offer camping opportunities in the Stoney Creek area. This area provides visitors with miles of roads, excellent fishing on the creek and its tributaries, hunting opportunities, and great berry picking.



**Access:** To access the Stoney Bridge primitive campsites take the Stoney Area turnoff from Forest Road 20 onto Forest Road 2054. Follow the 2054 road for about two miles then turn left onto Forest Road 2050. Drive another 3 miles, cross over Stoney Bridge and watch for the campsites on the left.

**Campsite Fee:** No fee

**Stay Limit:** 14 Days

**Number of Sites:** 2

**Facilities:** Tent site, fire ring, picnic table
