

# Recreation Opportunity Guide



## TWENTYMILE SPUR TRAIL

**Description:** The Twentymile Spur Trail follows an old logging road along the upper reaches of the Harris River watershed and ends at a set of beaver ponds.



**Access:** The trailhead is located at the end of FS Road #2025 off of the Hollis Highway. FS Road #2025 has a gravel surface and is maintained for passenger vehicles.

**Distance:** 1.3 miles (one way)

**Trip Time:** 45-60 minutes (one way)

**Difficulty:** Easy

**Elevation Change:** 100 feet

**Terrain:** The trail is an old logging road and receives light maintenance. The trail passes through a second growth spruce and hemlock forest.

**USGS Map:** Craig B-3 & Craig C-3

**Attractions:** The Twentymile Spur Trail parallels the upper section of Harris River before it ends at a set of beaver ponds. It is characterized as a nice walk through a second growth spruce and hemlock forest. The alder tree lined trail give the perception of hiking through a “green tunnel”. Occasionally the view opens up to the surrounding mountains and the upper Harris River valley. This trail is also a popular destination for wintertime activities such as cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.



**Special Considerations:** Small sections of the trail are rocky with short steep pitches. There is one creek that must be forded at approximately one mile. Hunters frequent the area during open season. There are no snow removal activities on FS Road #2025.
