

Recreation Opportunities and Closures in the Upper Fraser Area

December 8, 2008



The logging operations in the Fraser Valley are making progress. Beginning Monday, December 8, loggers will begin work north of the Leland Creek Road (NFSR 159) and south of the Flume Trail. Loggers will be removing beetle killed trees in the area. This is part of the Forest Service's larger effort in and

around communities to reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfires and protect watersheds.

Our Christmas Tree Sale which runs from December 6 and through December 13 is not affected by this logging activity. Our Christmas tree area is accessed from the Elk Creek Road (County Road 72).

Active Closures for Visitor Safety

Leland Creek Road:

- The Leland Creek Road (NFSR 159) will be closed to all public use and gated from its intersection with St. Louis Creek Road (NFSR 160) to the Zoom Trail. Logging trucks will be exiting from Leland Creek Road to St. Louis Creek Road. Visitor parking in this area must not block the gate.

Saint Louis Creek Road:

- This road will remain open during logging operations and be heavily used by logging trucks. Please use extra caution on this road.

Deadhorse Trailhead and Trail:

- The Deadhorse Trail and Trailhead are closed.

Creekside Trail:

- The Creekside Trail is open to skiers and snowmobilers; however, snowmobilers are prohibited on the southern 1/2 mile of the trail. Skiers may not exit the trail onto the Leland Creek Road.

Flume Trail:

- The Flume Trail is open, except for the southern 1/2 mile. Skiers cannot exit onto the Leland Creek Road.

Zoom Trail

- The Zoom Trail is open. The Leland Creek Road west of the Zoom Trail is closed to all public use.

Other Places to Recreate

For Skiers

- Spruce Creek Trail is open, however, skiers cannot use the Deadhorse Trail or loop.

For Snowmobilers

- Corona Pass area, also commonly known as Moffat Road and Rollins Pass, located near Winter Park is open.
- Church Park, commonly known as Crooked Creek off of County Road 50 is open.

Visitor tips for recreating near logging activities:

- Drive slowly on roads used by logging trucks. Make sure intersections and roads are clear before you enter them.
- Keep informed about closures and stay out of closed areas. Closures will be marked on our maps in red and on the ground. Our closures will be enforced.
- If you find yourself near logging activity, you are in the wrong place. Please exit the area immediately.
