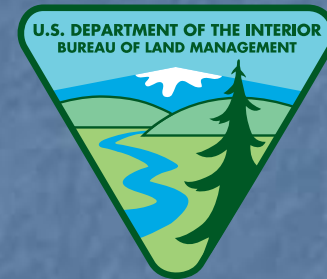
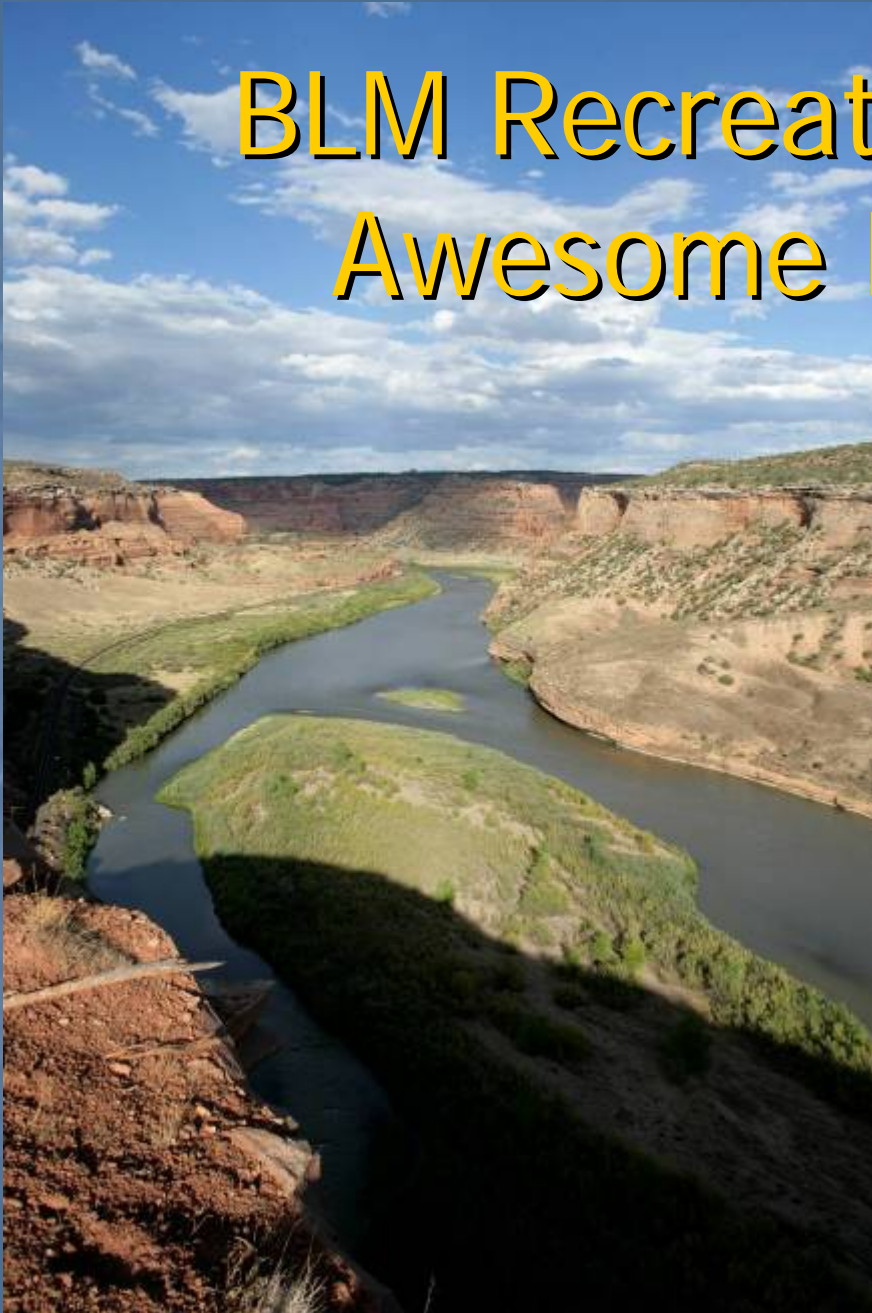

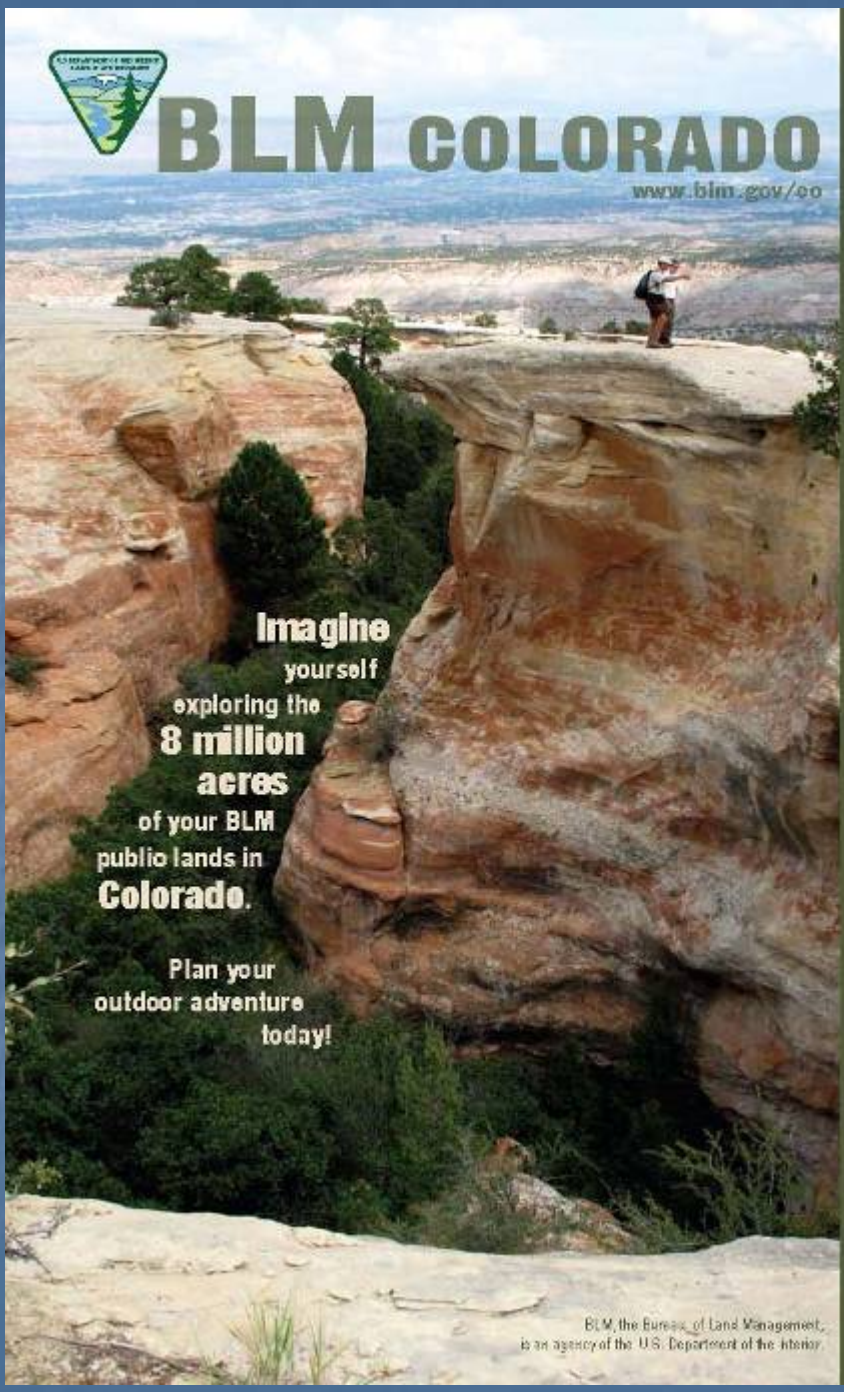

Recreation Strategy Objectives

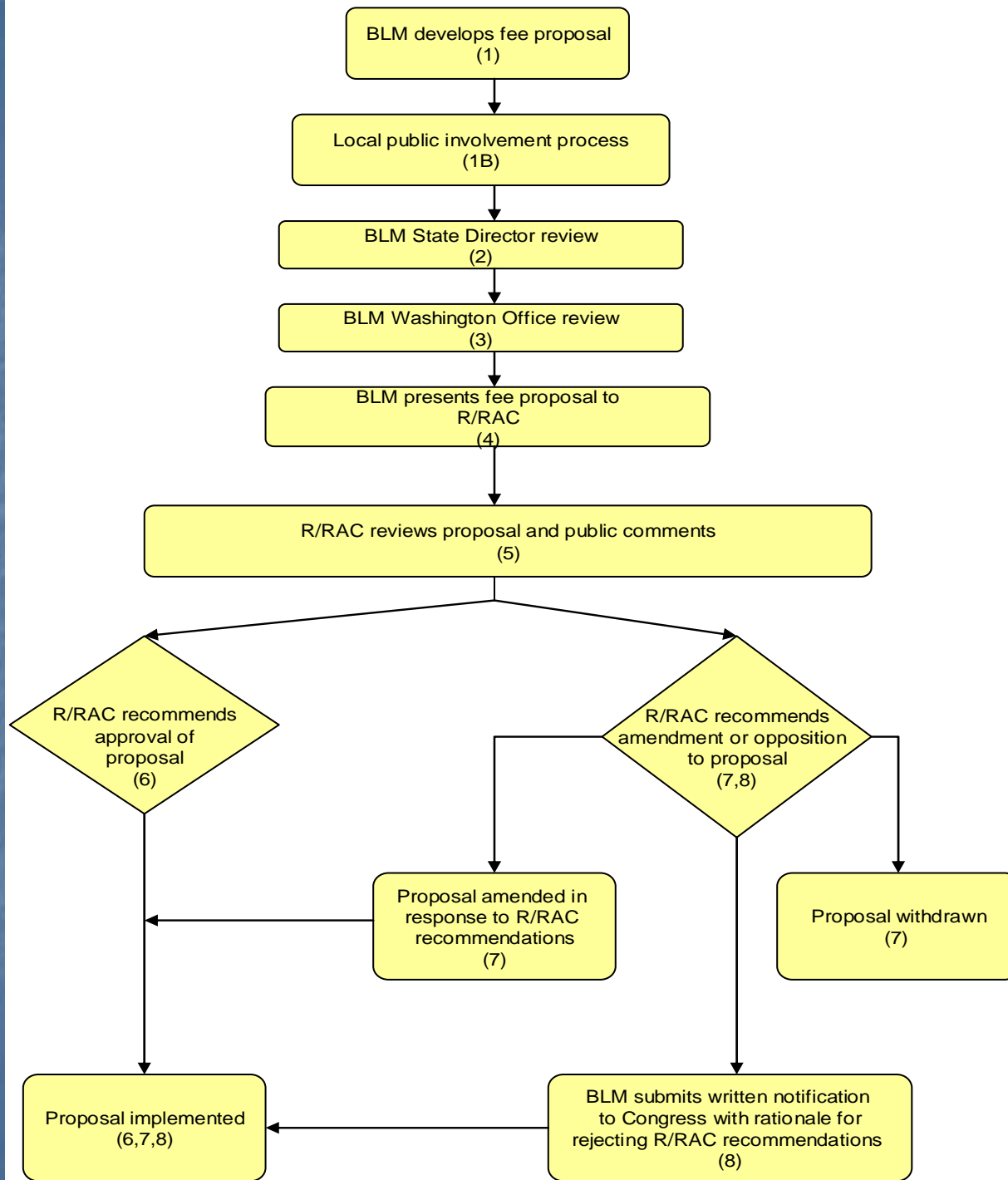
- Objective 1: Manage Public Lands for Recreation Experiences and Quality of Life
- Objective 2: Encourage Sustainable Travel/Tourism Collaboration with Gateway Communities
- Objective 3: Provide Fair Value and Fair Return through Fees and Commercial Services

Recreation Strategy Objectives

- Objective 4: Establish a Comprehensive Approach to Travel Planning and Management
- Objective 5: Ensure Public Health and Safety and Improve Facility Condition and Accessibility
- Objective 6: Enhance and Expand Visitor Services, Including Interpretation, Information and Education
- Objective 7: Encourage and Sustain Collaborative Partnerships, Volunteers and Public Service

Recreation Fees in Colorado

- BLM has over 5.8 million visitors annually
- BLM collected nearly \$190,000 in 2007 under Recreation Enhancement Act authority, in order to:
 - Operate, maintain, and reconstruct
 - Provide interpretive programs
 - Provide additional trail patrols

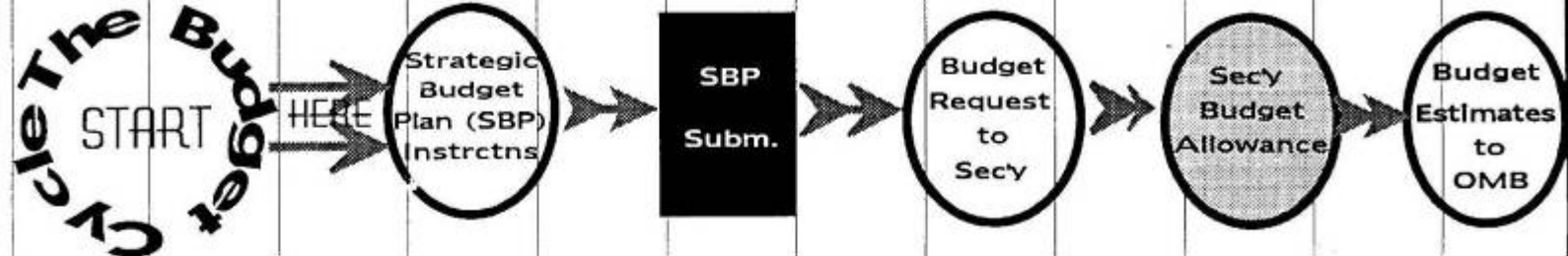

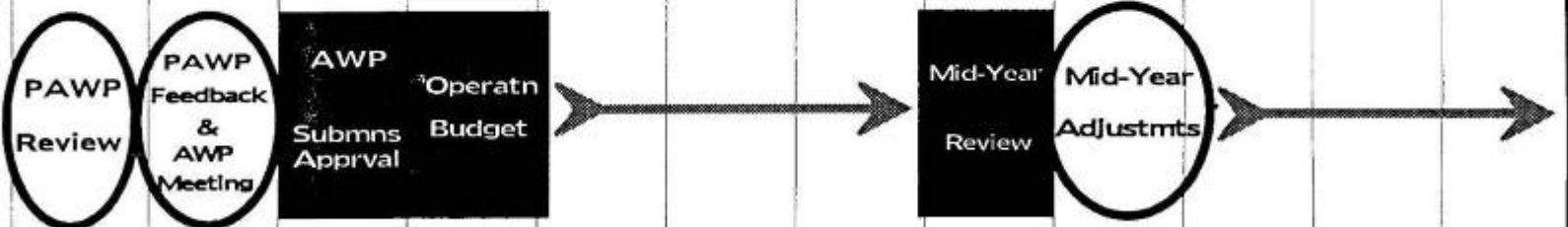
Program Year (PY), FY+2
