


Welcome to the WYOMING CENTENNIAL BYWAY DUBOIS, WYOMING



With expansive views of snow-capped peaks, sparkling lakes, abundant wildlife, sheer cliffs, and miles of hiking trails, the Wyoming Centennial Scenic Byway is a jewel in the crown of the west. As part of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, the Shoshone National Forest contains nearly 2.5 million acres of some of the most wild and rugged country in the Lower 48.



Trails



Access is abundant. Check at the Wind River Ranger Station in Dubois or Blackrock Ranger Station east of Moran Junction for specific trail information and conditions.

Winter Trail Use:

The Upper Wind River Country has more than 150 miles of groomed snowmobile trails accessing the Continental Divide Trail, which then connects to 665 miles of other Forest Service trails.

Ice fishing in the winter months is an exciting adventure, as is a dog sled ride at Brooks Lake near Togwootee Pass.

Cross country skiers enjoy the groomed trails, or venture off trail on their own.



Fishing and Hunting

The Wind River is home to rainbow trout, Snake River cutthroat, brook trout, and some Yellowstone cutthroat and is known as a fishing paradise! Wyoming fishing licenses apply.



Wildlife Viewing

Many of North America's spectacular wildlife can be seen in this country. Keep your eye open for grizzly, elk, coyote and deer.



Camping

Campgrounds on the byway are open through the summer and range in elevations from 7500 to 9300 feet. Be prepared for camping in grizzly bear country along the byway.
