


Following ANCIENT TRAILS



Along the Road

U.S. Highway 191 heads north from Pinedale to Jackson. You'll be traveling through high sage plains, across a pass at the Hoback Rim and down winding river canyons. Watch for wildlife and be sure to stop at historic signs along the way; they tell of early adventurers who blazed your trail. Daniel Junction, Bondurant, and Hoback Junction provide gas, meals, and lodging.

Enjoy all the experiences of the resort community of Jackson and continue up to Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks. Then, jump back on the Byway and travel to Dubois, a truly friendly western community.




Safety in Bear Country

Hike in groups and make noise. Bears don't like surprises. Carry bear spray and know how to use it.

Secure food, trash, and other attractants in a bear-resistant container, hang 10 feet high, or store in a hard-sided vehicle. All attractants must be stored at night or when unattended during the day. Ask about special regulations for harvested big game.

Human-food conditioned bears are bold and often must be destroyed.
