Greetings,

The Forest Service, working with Fremont and Park counties, is seeking individuals interested in serving on a 15-person resource advisory committee that will collaborate with the Forest Service on projects to benefit the Shoshone National Forest and the portion of the Bridger-Teton National Forest in Fremont and Park counties.

The committee will oversee funding that was reauthorized under the Secure Rural Schools Act, reauthorized by Congress last October.

The Forest Service and the counties will solicit nominees and forward a list of nominations to the Secretary of Agriculture for approval and selection.

If you would like to be considered as a member of the Park-Fremont Resource Advisory Committee, you must

- Complete the membership interest form.
- Complete the background information form (AD-755).

You are encouraged to submit an optional one-page resume to help with the selection process, though a resume is not required.

The background information form is not used as part of the selection process, though it is necessary for the United States Department of Agriculture to perform background checks on nominees. All completed forms will be kept in a locked, secure cabinet.

Please send completed forms to Shoshone National Forest, Attention Bryan Armel, 808 Meadow Lane Avenue, Cody, Wyoming 82414. Printed, signed applications are due May 18, 2009. We anticipate organizing the committee will take six to eight months, due to the selection process and background check requirements.
