10 - MINERS CREEK ROAD - FSR 1000

Difficulty: EASY

Trail Use: Moderate

Length: 2.53 miles (one-way)

Elevation: Starts at 9,134 feet and ends at 9,918 feet (highest point 9,988 feet)

Elevation Gain: +859 feet – 75 feet = +784 feet

Open To: CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING, SNOWSHOEING, SNOWMOBILING

Access:

- From I-70 take Exit 203, Frisco / Breckenridge, and travel south on HWY 9 toward Breckenridge
- From the Main Street and Summit Boulevard (HWY 9) traffic light continue for .5 miles to the next traffic light (the County Commons entrance).
- Turn right at the traffic light, which is County Road 1004. Follow this road for approximately 200 yards and turn right, then an immediate left turn.
- Continue on this road for another .5 miles and there is a parking area next to a gate. Park and unload here.

Trail Highlights:

- The trail continues up past the gate and along the bike path.
- Follow the road up and across the bike path. Your first attraction will be Rainbow Lake, which is on the right-hand side.
- At the end of the road you will notice the Peaks Trail. The Peaks Trail is for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing only!

Important Information:

- **THIS ROAD IS USED FOR MULTIPLE ACTIVITIES TO INCLUDE CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING, SNOWSHOEING AND SNOWMOBILING. PLEASE RESPECT OTHER USERS.**
- There are few roads and open areas to ride on.
- The trail ends at the turn around point.
