Broyles' Type I Great Basin Incident Management Team assumed management of the Brins Fire today at 8:00 p.m. A transition of command is currently taking place between Broyles' Team and Reinarz's Type II Team.

The Brins Fire moved down off Wilson Mountain to the northeast toward Highway 89A early this afternoon. It is now in a canyon on the west side of Highway 89A, between Manzanita Campground and Encinoso Picnic Area. It is expected to reach the highway late this evening.

Because of the fire moving into Oak Creek Canyon, powerlines in the area were de-energized and emergency sirens were activated by the Sedona Fire District. Highway 89A remains closed to all but essential firefighting personnel. In addition, residents who remained behind following the initial evacuation were advised to evacuate.

The fire remains on the west side of Highway 89A. Structural protection measures are in place for residences and other structures on the east side of the highway.
