

“Discover Archaeology at Elden Pueblo”



A weekend adventure to explore past cultures.

The workshop is available to 3rd grade brownies and older.

The Saturday workshop will allow scouts to earn the Archaeology Badge. A complete description of the schedule of activities related to the badge requirements follows.

For Jr. and Cadet Scouts interested in service projects related to this badge, a select number of Scouts will be allowed to camp overnight at the site, and participate in a site assessment service project on Sunday. A campfire talk will be planned for Saturday night.

The Sunday morning activity allows Scouts and their parent-chaperones to assist the US Forest Service by visiting sites listed on the National Register of Historic and Cultural Sites to assess their current condition. Selected sites are evaluated for threats by human activity, fire danger, new or illegal roads impact, effects of grazing land leases and natural erosion. Comparative studies are performed, comparing current conditions with the last, recorded assessment visit. This activity is critical for public land managers in determining future needs for site preservation. The Cactus-Pine council members are invited to be a part of this very important study.

Scouts have the option to attend the Saturday only program, or camp overnight to attend the Sunday field work. Motel options are also available at each participant/family's discretion.

For each troop registered, two troop leaders/chaperones are free.
Additional adults are \$15 each.

Bring: Lunch, snacks, water, hat, sunscreen and your sense of adventure.
Closed toe shoes preferred. Garden gloves are optional. All site and field equipment will be provided.

There is limited registration.

Saturday Scout workshop is limited to 50 scouts.

Camping and Sunday Field Work activity can accommodate 30 persons total.
