2004 Annual Fuelwood Sale Applications.

The Nogales Ranger District of the Coronado National Forest will have fuelwood applications available beginning Tuesday, September 7, 2004 for the annual dead and down fuelwood cutting season. The cutting season will be 31 days in length, beginning on Friday, October 1, 2004 and ending on Sunday, October 31, 2004. There will be 150 permits issued for one cord of wood district-wide. We will issue an additional 50 permits for October and November that will be for use only in the Potrero Fuels Treatment Area.

Applications are for dead-and-down wood to be cut District-wide. No green wood permits will be issued this year. Permits will sell for \$25.00 per cord. Application may be made for one (1) district-wide permit or one (1) Potrero Area permit. As a reminder, any other material, such as rocks or plants, removed from National Forest lands requires a separate permit that may be obtained at any Forest Service office.

[Applications](#) for fuelwood permits may be picked up beginning Tuesday, September 7, 2004 at the Nogales Ranger Station, 303 Old Tucson Road, Nogales, AZ; at the Coronado National Forest Supervisor's Office, 300 West Congress, 6th floor, Tucson, AZ; or at the Patagonia or Sonoita post office. The hours for the Forest Service offices are Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm. You may also access the Nogales Ranger District homepage on the Internet at <http://www.fs.fed.us/r3/coronado/nrd/nogo.html> and print an application. All applications must be accompanied by a check or money order in the amount of \$25.00, made payable to USDA Forest Service, and a stamped, self-addressed envelope. Mail the completed application to the Nogales Ranger District, 303 Old Tucson Road, Nogales, AZ, 85621. Please read the application instructions, [rules and regulations](#) carefully; there will be no refund of the fee and no extension of the cutting season. Permits for those applications received in the Nogales Ranger Station will be mailed prior to the cutting season. After October 1, 2004, permits may be obtained in person at the Nogales Ranger Station. A completed application will be required as well as a check or money order in the amount of \$25.00 made out to USDA Forest Service.
