




# OVERLAND ROAD HISTORIC TRAIL #113

Williams Ranger District



## Trailhead Locations:

As the accompanying map shows, there are several trailheads which provide access to the Overland Road hiking and equestrian trail. Interpretive signs with information about the history of the Overland Road can be found at the trailheads. This route has been marked across the Kaibab National Forest with closely-spaced rock cairns, distinctive brass caps, tree blazes, and 4" wood posts. Most of these roads are suitable for passenger vehicles.



## Trail Information:

**Length:** 25 miles one way

**Rating:** Easy to moderate

**Use:** Light

**Hiking Time:** A variety of access points provide for hikes of varying length and time

**Use Restrictions:** Travel by motorized vehicles on sections of the Overland Road located off of Forest Service roads, is prohibited.

**Additional Comments:** Mountain biking is good along FR 57. Horseback riding is recommend anywhere along the trail between FR 141 and FR 139, although it may become rocky in the Pomeroy Tanks area. Recommended hiking sections are shown on the map.
