### **Native Fish Aquarium and Display Is Complete**

*The long wait is over. The native fish interpretive display is finally finished and now resides in front of the 180-gallon aquarium located in the Walatowa Visitor Center.*

*The final piece is an interactive display that challenges visitors to name each of the native New Mexico fish in the artwork: Rio Grande cutthroat trout, Rio Grande chub, Rio Grande sucker, and longnose dace. Visitors can use the clues provided to help identify them. When visitors are done guessing, they can flip up the panels to find the answers underneath the artwork of each different fish in the scene. The final challenge is to find and identify the real fish in the aquarium.*
