Board (the "Board") of the Ashley Valley Sewer Management Board, Uintah County, Utah (the "Issuer") adopted a resolution (the "Resolution") in which it authorized the issuance of the Issuer's Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2009 (the "Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Seven Million Dollars (\$7,000,000) to bear interest at the rate of not more than three and one-half percent (3.5%), to mature in not more than thirty-five (35) years from their date or dates, and to be sold at a price not less than ninety nine percent (99%) of the total principal amount thereof. NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the Issuer called a public hearing for the purpose of inviting public comment on the proposed issuance of the Bonds and the economic impact that the improvements proposed to be financed with the Bonds will have on the private sector. The public hearing will be held on March 16, 2009, at 5:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as feasible, at the Vernal City Office, 447 East Main Street, Vernal, Utah. As sewer revenue bonds, no taxes will be pledged to repay the Bonds. The Bonds, pursuant to the Resolution and a Final Bond Resolution to be adopted authorizing and confirming the sale of the Bonds for the purposes of (i) financing the construction of additions and improvements to the Issuer's Sewer system and related improvements and (ii) paying issuance expenses to be incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. The Bonds are to be issued and sold by the Issuer pursuant to the Resolution, including as part of said Resolution the draft of a Final Bond Resolution which was before the Board and attached to the Resolution in substantially final form at the time of the adoption of the Resolution (collectively, the "Bond Resolutions") and said Final Bond Resolution is to be adopted by the Board in such form and with such changes thereto as shall be approved by the Board upon the adoption thereof; provided that the principal amount, interest rate or rates, maturity, and discount of the Bonds will not exceed the maximums set forth above. Project Description: Chevron USA Pipeline Company has requested permission to operate the Hanna petroleum pumping station as a stationary area source. The Hanna station receives crude oil, condensable hydrocarbons, and black wax throughput from the company owned pipeline on its way to Salt Lake City. The Hanna station serves as a buffer to pipeline operations allowing production to ebb and flow while at the same time maintaining a consistent throughput within the pipeline. Plant equipment includes four storage tanks (one with 1,680,000 gallon capacity and three with 2,520,000 gallon capacity), electric pump motors, and various comfort heating equipment items rated less than 5,000,000 Btu/hr each. The emissions, in tons per year, will be as follows: VOC = 12.27, HAPs = 0.33

The completed engineering evaluation and air quality impact analysis showed that the proposed project meets the requirements of federal air quality regulations and the State air quality rules. U.S. Forest Service - Ashley National Forest Flaming Gorge Ranger District, Daggett County, Utah LITTLE ELK SUMMIT FUELS REDUCTION PROJECT Implementation of the Little Elk Summit Fuels Reduction Project is currently on hold. Work has halted due to a national injunction on the use of the Hazardous Fuels Reduction Category Exclusion (HFRCE) which was used to authorize the treatment. This

injunction was issued by the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of California on 11/25/08, following a ruling by the U.S. Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in 12/5/07. District Ranger Jeff Schramm is formally withdrawing his decision of 9/22/06, documented in a Decision Memo, to implement the Little Elk Summit Fuels Reduction Project under the HFRCE. The decision authorized approximately 818 acres of mechanical removal of conifers and 3,712 prescribed fire acres within the project area. The mechanical work and some of the prescribed burning were completed prior to the court injunction. The purpose of the project was three-fold: 1) to reduce hazardous fuels within the

In the Clay Basin field, natural gas is dried by twenty-six (26) existing dehydration units which are located at separate injection/withdrawal wells. The dehydration units were installed during original construction of the Kastler Compressor Station located in Daggett County. Thirteen (13) of the dehydration units are grandfathered and the other 13 are permitted in DAQE-716-96. The dry natural gas is stored underground and then recovered for distribution and sale. The dehydration units are located at individual well sites that are located on contiguous and adjacent properties and are under common control, but as per definition of facility in 40 CFR 63.761 are considered separately.
