where they are cutting.


Many Open Forest Roads cut

Open Roads are designated  
on the ground with a sign,  
that shows the route number and  
has a white arrow underneath  
the route number.

-  Open Forest Roads: **Firewood Cutting Allowed**  
Within 300 feet from either side of the road
-  Roads Open - High Clearance Vehicles only  
Firewood Cutting Allowed
-  Powerline - No Firewood Cutting Allowed
-  Highway 20 and the Mesa Falls Scenic Byway (Hwy 47)  
**No Firewood Cutting Allowed**
-  **No Firewood Cutting Allowed**
-  Private and State Land - **No Firewood Cutting Allowed**
-  Ashton Ranger District Office
-  Administrative Sites - No Firewood Cutting Allowed
-  Cabin Rentals - No Firewood Cutting Allowed

-  Upper Mesa Falls and Bear Gulch - No Firewood Cutting Allowed
-  Rivers
-  Lakes, Reservoirs, and Wet Areas - No Firewood Cutting within 300 Feet



Conditions of Permit:  
  
Dead trees of all species may be harvested.  
(standing or down)  
  
Stumps should be no higher than 12 inches.  
  
Maximum product length is 7 feet.  
Log Notching will not be acceptable.
