An Actual Use Report must be submitted to your Range Management Specialist within 45 days after livestock are removed from the Forest as specified on page 12, Part 3 of your Term Grazing Permit.

Salting: Salt must be placed no closer than ¼ mile from water sources, designated roads, trails, or recreation sites.

Improvement maintenance will be done prior to turn out. Wildlife escape ramps must be installed in all troughs.

By USDA order 04-00-097, all non-pelletized hay, straw or mulch processed, stored, or transported on National Forest System Lands, in individual bales or containers, must be tagged or marked as weed free, or must have the original and current evidence of weed free certification documentation present.
