Rotation Schedule

Temporary permits have been issued for Dry Creek and Willow Creek C&H to accommodate livestock due to the effect of fires on the Camp Gulch and part of the 76 Creek units of the Bruneau Summer

C&H. Marge has promised to have riders on the allotments this summer to make sure cattle are well distributed and utilization levels have not been exceeded, also to ensure that cattle are kept off the burn.

Salting: Salt must be placed no closer than ¼ mile from water sources, designated roads, trails, or recreation sites.

Maintenance:

Improvement maintenance will be done prior to turn out. Wildlife escape ramps must be installed in all troughs.

New Improvements:

Marge agreed to hire Rollie to work on replacing fences burned during the Murphy fire. FS will supply approximately 3 to 5 miles of materials, depending on condition of fences.

Other:

By USDA order 04-00-097, all non-pelletized hay, straw or mulch processed, stored, or transported on National Forest System Lands, in individual bales or containers, must be tagged or marked as weed free, or must have the original and current evidence of weed free certification documentation present. All markings must meet the State and/or County standards for certification as weed free.
