Small site-specific herbicide treatment of larkspur (La Sal and Geyser Pass areas) and state designated noxious weeds (Roadsides, South Mesa, and Deer Springs Creek areas)	
Completing an extensive sale of ponderosa pine and aspen timber on private land on east side of La Sal Mountains. Large portion of the sale followed an area that burned in a wild fire in mid 1990s.
