Recreation Fee Program

Here is what your fee dollars enabled us to do:

- Administered outfitter guide and recreation event special use permits.
- Enhanced visitor services by increasing recreation personnel presence and compliance patrols at all sites across the forest.
- Increased maintenance personnel time at all campgrounds.
- Installed a new kiosk at Big Flat Campground.
- Replaced the windows at Buck Park Rental Cabin.
- Removed old outhouse at Buck Park Rental Cabin and installed a new vault toilet.
- Completed trail clearing on popular trails.
- Accomplished routine maintenance at all fee sites.

Special Feature

Bordered by two of the deepest canyons in North America and containing vast portions of the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness, the Payette National Forest is nationally recognized for dramatic landscapes. The topography of the Forest ranges from rugged mountain peaks that feature high alpine meadows and crystal blue lakes to steeply plummeting river canyons.


Recreation Fee Program


