Price Creek Pasture will be transition move pasture when cattle leave Withington Creek and move to Haynes Creek, 10 days allowed for cows and calves to mother up. Cattle will be allowed in the Haynes Creek Pasture for overnight as the move to Cheney Creek happens. Haynes Basin has heavy fuel load and wolves. The operators are reluctant to place cattle in the area.

Range Improvement List:

- Haynes Creek Pipeline needs the end tank moved to the west side of the road to avoid the pipeline being cut by the road grader.
- Spring development in Lower Grade Creek pasture needs developed.
- State Law herd health and bull numbers were discussed.
- Water rights (stock water) on State Lands was discussed by the association. Two rights were contested by the State. One right was relinquished by the association. The other is still held by the association.
