



Travel Map Uinta National Forest




-  Gravel Road (ATV, Motorcycle OK)

Routes and areas on the Forest are closed to motorized use unless designated open on the travel plan, or posted open on the ground.

Some travel off designated routes is permitted when:

1. Exercising the provisions of a valid permit to utilize Forest products in designated areas.
2. Utilizing undeveloped camp or picnicking areas within 150 feet of a designated Forest development road or trail unless that area is posted closed to camping and/or picnicking.
3. Otherwise authorized by a Forest Officer.

This map is to be used to define what road and trails on the Uinta National Forest are open to motorized and non-motorized uses, as shown above. No attempt has been made to show these uses on adjacent or surrounding lands. Check with the appropriate officials for uses in these areas.
