

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

USDA Forest Service UINTA NATIONAL FOREST HEBER RANGER DISTRICT WASATCH COUNTY, UTAH

The Heber Ranger District of the Uinta National Forest has received a request to construct a road and grant an easement for access to private property, and grant an easement along Forest Road #602 for access to private property:

1. A private road easement to construct an access road to private property across National Forest System Lands. The proposed location of the access road is two miles from Highway 40 along Forest Road 480; the legal description is T.4 S., R.8 E, Section 6, Uintah Special Meridian. The proposed road would be 34 feet wide by 212 feet long, or approximately 0.25 acres. The road would be constructed to provide proper drainage and minimize erosion. The dominant vegetation type is sagebrush, no trees would be removed. All road maintenance will be performed by the land owner.
2. A Forest Road easement along approximately 50 feet of Forest Road #602 for access to private property. A reciprocal easement will be acquired by the Forest Service across Road #602 through private property for continued public access to National Forest System lands located behind the private property. The location of the access road is approximately 1.5 miles from Highway 40 along Forest Road #480; the legal description is T.4 S., R.8 E, Section 6, Uintah Special Meridian.

The public is invited to provide comment on the proposed action. Send substantive comments to the Responsible Official, Julie King, District Ranger, Heber Ranger District, P.O. Oral or written comments may also be submitted at Heber Ranger District located at 2460 South Highway 40 in Heber City during normal business hours from 8:00 to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday, excluding federal holidays. Comments need to be postmarked or received within 30 days beginning the day following publication of this notice in the Provo Daily Herald.
