

Notice of Decision

On May 1, 2009 Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest Supervisor, Brian Ferebee made a decision to authorize a special use permit to Ogden City for the construction and use of a 629-foot segment of road on National Forest System land. The road will provide access for the construction and maintenance of an Ogden City water storage tank on private land adjacent to the National Forest. The road and reservoir site are located in the Taylor Canyon vicinity east of the Ogden City limit at approximately 28th Street in Section 35, T6N, R1W.

This decision is subject to appeal pursuant to Forest Service regulations at 36 CFR 215. Appeals must meet the content requirements of 36 CFR 215.14. Only individuals or organizations who submitted comments or otherwise expressed interest in the project during the comment period may appeal. Appeals must be postmarked or received by the Appeal Deciding Officer within 45 days of the publication of this notice in the Salt Lake Tribune. This date is the exclusive means for calculating the time to file an appeal. Timeframe information from other sources should not be relied on. Incorporation of documents by reference is not allowed. The Appeal Deciding Officer is Regional Forester Harv Forsgren.
