

**FIRE RESTRICTIONS**

**ANGELES NATIONAL FOREST**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and because of the fire danger, the following acts are prohibited on the Angeles National Forest. This order is effective from July 22, 2004 through the end of the official 2004 fire season.

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire or stove fire. 36 CFR 261.52(a).
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building. 36 CFR 261.52(d).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a Special Use Permit from the Forest Service for a recreation residence, resort or organization camp on the San Gabriel River Ranger District may use lanterns and stoves fueled by pressurized gas or jellied petroleum while they are in their recreation residence, or on National Forest System lands covered by the terms of their Special Use Permit.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or fire-fighting force while in the performance of an official duty.
3. Persons with a California Campfire Permit are not exempt from the prohibitions listed above. However, persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the use of lanterns or stoves fueled by compressed gas or jellied petroleum may use these lanterns and stoves at the sites listed below and posted on the ground:
  - a. Manker Campground.
  - b. Coldbrook Campground.
  - c. Oaks Picnic Area.
  - d. West Fork Day Use Area.
  - e. Glenn Campground.
  - f. In the San Gabriel Canyon, the area west and below the East Fork Fire Station known as Coyote Flats, south to the confluence of the East Fork of the San Gabriel River and Cattle Canyon and west to Camp Williams.

- g. In the San Gabriel Canyon, the area from Camp Williams west along the East Fork of the San Gabriel River to the San Gabriel Canyon Off Highway Area and west to the West Fork Day Use Area.
- h. In the San Gabriel Canyon, the area from the West Fork Day Use Area north along the North Fork of the San Gabriel River to the north Cal-Trans bridge on State Highway 39.
- i. In the San Antonio Canyon, the portion of San Antonio Creek immediately west of the Lower San Antonio Fire Station and west of the Mt. Baldy Trout Pools.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions contained in 36 CFR Part 261, Sub-Part A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
