Activities/Facilities Within 5 Miles

- ◆ Swimming

- ◆ Car top boat launching available at Salt Springs Reservoir. Access to the water is difficult. Boating is hazardous when windy (usually in the afternoons).
- ◆ Hiking in Mokelumne Wilderness (**permit required for overnight use, year round**). Permits available at Carson Pass Information Station (summer only) and the Amador Ranger Station. The trailhead is at Salt Springs Reservoir.

Things You Should Know

- ◆ **No Reservations.** Sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis.


- ◆ The campground is generally open year round.
- ◆ The campground is at about 3,200' elevation.
- ◆ Restroom cleaning is provided mid-May to mid-November. No garbage service. Pack it In, Pack it Out.
- ◆ There is no piped water at the campground. Water from the river is available but should be boiled before using. Water quality testing is not performed on open water sources.
- ◆ OHV use is not allowed in the campground. OHV's must be trailered to staging areas and authorized routes in the Bear River Reservoir area..
- ◆ Please keep family pets on a leash at all times.
- ◆ Use only dead and down wood for your campfires.
- ◆ Make sure your fire is dead out before leaving. Please use water only (not soil).


