Activities/Facilities Within 5 Miles

- ◆ Swimming
- ◆ Fishing
- ◆ Picnicking (8 wheelchair accessible sites)
- ◆ Boating (No motors allowed at Woods Lake).
- ◆ Hiking access to Mokelumne Wilderness (**permit required for overnight use year-round**). Permits available at Carson Pass Information Station (summer only) and the Amador Ranger Station. Fee parking available at Woods Lake trailhead, 1/2 mile before campground.
- ◆ Caples Lake Resort: restaurant, store, boat launch, boat rentals, laundry, fishing licenses, phone, cabin rentals.

Things You Should Know

- ◆ **No Reservations.** Sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis.
- ◆ Interagency Senior and Access passes are accepted for single family units.

- ◆ Trailers are not recommended because of the difficulty of getting trailers in and out of the area.
- ◆ The campground is generally open between July 1st and Oct. 15th. These dates are affected by snowfall.
- ◆ All food must be stored in the food lockers (Bear Boxes).
- ◆ The campground is at about 8,200' elevation.
- ◆ Single units are limited to a maximum of 2 vehicles and 6 people. Double units are 4 vehicles and 12 people. Additional fee required for extra vehicle.
- ◆ Campground host on site. Please check with the host or entrance board before setting up your camp.
- ◆ Please keep family pets on a leash at all times.
- ◆ Please use the stove or fire ring provided and make sure your fire is dead out before leaving. Use only water, not soil.
- ◆ Use only dead and down wood for your campfires.
- ◆ Check out time is 1:00 p.m.
