
Things You Should Know

- ◆ **No Reservations.** Sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis,
- ◆ The road going into the campground is rough. 4WD vehicles are recommended. 2-WD pickups can make it provided they have ample ground clearance.
- ◆ Because of the remote location of the campground, emergency medical aid is not readily available. A well-stocked first aid kit is a necessity.
- ◆ No garbage service. Pack It In, Pack It Out.

- ◆ The campground is generally accessible between mid-June and mid-October. These dates are affected by snow conditions.
- ◆ The campground is at about 6,200' elevation.
- ◆ Sites are limited to a maximum of 2 vehicles and 6 people.
- ◆ There is no piped water at the campground. Stream water is available but should be boiled before using. Water quality testing is not performed on open water sources.
- ◆ Please keep family pets on a leash at all times.
- ◆ Please use the stove or fire ring provided.
- ◆ Use only dead and down wood for your campfires.
- ◆ Make sure your fire is dead out before leaving.
- ◆ No campfires allowed during fire restrictions.


Location Map
