GOOSENEST RANGER DISTRICT SPRING MUSHROOM PERMITS ON SALE

Macdoel, CA – The Goosenest Spring mushroom harvest season begins today on the Goosenest Ranger District of the Klamath National Forest. Permits are available only at the Goosenest Ranger District Office and are valid only within the Goosenest Ranger District.

The spring mushroom season includes, but is not limited to: Morel's, Boletus, Shaggy Mane and Puff Balls. Matsutake mushrooms are not a part of this harvest. This year, three permits are available: a 10-day, non-consecutive permit for \$20; a 30-day consecutive permit for \$50; and a seasonal permit for \$100. These permits are valid for both personal and commercial use, but are not valid on private lands.

The Goosenest Ranger District office is located approximately three miles south of Macdoel, California, on Highway 97. The District boundaries are run approximately 20 miles north of Weed, California, and approximately 20 miles south of the Oregon border. Forest Maps are available at all Klamath National Forest office in Macdoel, Yreka, Ft. Jones and Happy Camp.
