Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and because of the fire danger, the following acts are prohibited within the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit. This order is effective from August 2, 2004, through the end of the official fire season.

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, charcoal fire, campfire, or stove fire, except within the stoves and fire rings provided in the developed campgrounds, camps and resorts, or recreation residence tracts shown on Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.52(a).
2. Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device. 36 CFR 261.52(f).
3. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, within a developed campground shown on Exhibit A, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material. 36 CFR 261.52(d).
4. Operating an internal combustion engine off of National Forest System roads and trails, except for the Sand Pit Off-Highway Vehicle Area, and boats or dredges on a water surface. 36 CFR 261.52(h).
5. Welding, or operating an acetylene or other torch with an open flame. 36 CFR 261.52(i).
6. Using an explosive. 36 CFR 261.52(b).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. Persons with a valid Wilderness Permit or a Campfire Permit are not exempt from the prohibitions shown above. However, persons with a valid Desolation Wilderness Permit may use a portable gas or liquefied-petroleum stove or lantern in the Desolation Wilderness. In addition, persons with a valid Campfire Permit may use a portable gas or liquefied-petroleum stove or lantern outside of the Desolation Wilderness.
3. Persons with a valid 2004 Forest Products Removal Permit (firewood permit) from the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit may cut firewood, provided that the cutting of firewood is done in compliance with the terms of the permit.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.
