Monitoring Tours Scheduled for Summer and Fall 2007

QUINCY, CA – Seven monitoring tours are scheduled this summer and fall across the Herger-Feinstein Quincy Library Group (HFQLG) Pilot Project Area, with the first trip scheduled for June 5.

These field trips will look at a variety of forest treatment projects ranging from thinning and fuels reduction to riparian restoration. The Pilot Project Area includes the Lassen and Plumas National Forests and the Sierraville Ranger District of the Tahoe National Forest.

The tours provide a chance to get an overview of the variety of projects being applied in the National Forests. Forest Service employees will also be gathering feedback during these trips from the public and other government agencies about how to improve future project management.

Several of the projects have data from before and after the treatments for comparison.

Many of the field trips will take a full day and participants should plan on bringing water and lunch.

The terrain varies from district to district. Participants should wear appropriate shoes and be prepared for some walking on possibly uneven terrain.
