Residential Burn Ban Effective June 4

A ban on residential burning went into effect on June 4, as ordered by the CAL-FIRE (formerly CDF), Butte Ranger Unit. This ban on residential burning affects those private lands in Plumas County under the fire protection of the Plumas National Forest. In other words, if a burn permit is obtained from the Plumas National Forest, this restriction applies. Private land under the fire protection of CAL-FIRE Lassen-Modoc Unit such as Chester, Janesville and Doyle, may have different restrictions, so check with CAL-FIRE or other local fire departments.

On the national forest, that is, public land, woodcutting and campfire restrictions **will not** go into effect at this time. However, woodcutters and those who recreate are advised that restrictions are expected to change as weather and fire conditions warrant. Woodcutters are urged to cut firewood now while the forest is still open to woodcutting.

Reminder: fireworks are **never** allowed on the Plumas National Forest at any time.

Key Points:
