Reduction of Lake Davis Closure Area

A temporary public safety closure of Lake Davis related to the pike eradication project is reduced in size effective November 14. The open areas from the perimeter road to ridgetop will allow woodcutting and Christmas tree cutting activities.

The new closure area includes Lake Davis, the shorelines, and all roads leading directly to the lake. Additionally, the area between County Road 112 and 126 and Forest Road 24N10 will remain closed. This reduced closure area will remain in effect until Lake Davis is found to be free of rotenone constituents.

The closure was part of the California Department of Fish and Game's implementation of the Lake Davie Pike Eradication Project.
