Note:

Open water sources are easily contaminated by human or animal waste. Water from springs, lakes, ponds, and streams should be properly treated before drinking. One recommended method of treatment is to bring clear water to a rolling boil for five minutes.

Trail Description


Get away from the hustle and bustle to relax in the shade of a maple tree. The Hartman Bar National Recreation Trail offers a beautiful setting for a day or weekend of fun.

(The trail is generally open for hiking from mid-June to mid-November, snow and road conditions permitting.)

Beginning at an elevation of 4,833 feet, you will wind down the Hartman Bar Ridge, reaching a flat, sandy camping area on the banks of the Middle Fork Feather River. Bring your camera to capture these outstanding canyon views. In the spring, you will see blooming flowers and trees such as *bleeding hearts* and native *dogwood* lining the trail. In the summer, this cool walk through the forest is a great escape from the summer heat.

Be Aware:

Remote area (Bring a first aid kit)
 River is fast and cold early in season
 Steep trail - allow extra time to hike out


