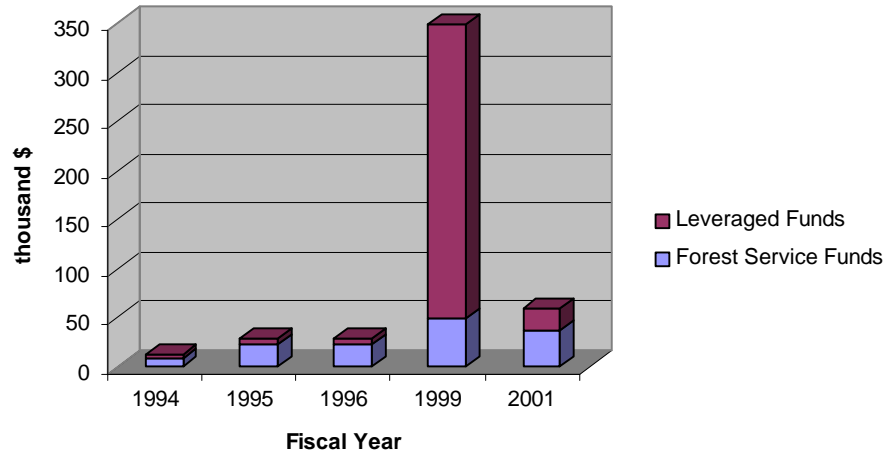
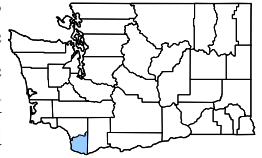




# Economic Action Programs Clark County, Washington

Clark County, located on the Columbia River in southwest Washington, is one of the state's original counties. Named after Captain William Clark, it included all territory north of the Columbia and east of the Cowlitz rivers. The county was first settled in 1825 when the Hudson's Bay Company established Fort Vancouver as its regional headquarters. Today Clark County is a major manufacturing and shipping center for wood products, metals and agricultural products.
